

Cost of the Institute

The price for the 2007 program is \$425 per student for the week-long program. The price covers the costs of room, board, health and accident insurance, campus services, instructors, etc. The registration deadline has been extended to June 20, 2007. 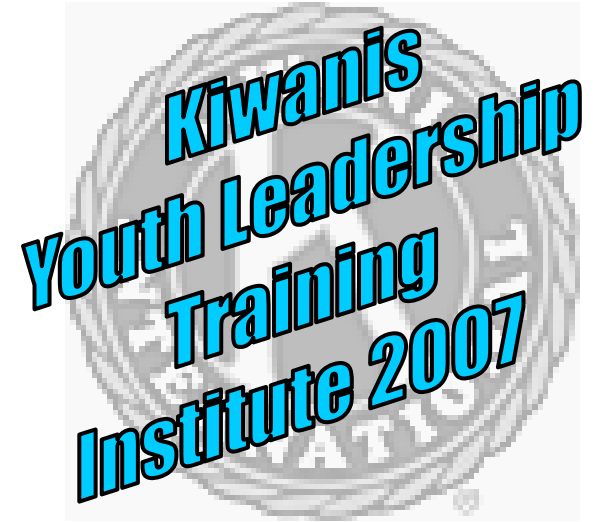

**KIWANIS YOUTH LEADERSHIP
TRAINING INSTITUTE – 2007**

Basic Information

The Kiwanis Youth Leadership Institute is a program of the New Jersey Kiwanis Foundation and Kiwanis Clubs throughout the New Jersey District. This week-long program is designed to develop the leadership abilities of students entering grades seven, eight and nine. They will be guided in activities to discover, explore and apply learned leadership skills in real-life situations.

The Institute program will be offered twice in July, 2007. The first session will begin on Sunday, July 8 and end on Saturday, July 14. The second session will run from Sunday, July 22 through Saturday, July 28. Each session will have a graduation program, with families and Kiwanis sponsors invited to attend!

Both sessions will be conducted by a special, professional faculty and trained facilitators on the beautiful campus of The College of New Jersey in Ewing Township, NJ. This is a “*live-in*” institute, designed to use academic classroom sessions as well as a leadership simulation experience.

The primary goals of the Institute’s program are to guide each participant in the acquisition of leadership skills: how to think straight, talk straight, and decide how to deal with problems often encountered in real-life situations.

The course will include the opportunity to meet and learn from dynamic leaders from the worlds of education, politics and

government, religious institutions, and business and industry. These leaders will discuss the dimensions of leadership in their respective fields.

Who Should Attend?

The Institute is designed for those boys and girls who need to be inspired, quickened and awakened. It is for the student who has a potential to become a leader, but in whom leadership skills have not yet fully surfaced. The program is designed to help young people who could really blossom if given the nourishment of attention and inspiration. The Institute seeks to work with boys and girls who understand the virtues of kindness and charity and who will use them as they grow into positions of leadership.

Objectives of the Institute

1. To aid youth in the achievement of recognizing a greater sense of identity, autonomy, competence, integrity, etc.
2. To acquaint participants with both the promise and the problems of group decision making.
3. To demonstrate to participants that a good leader is one who works well with a group.
4. To aid participants to free their creative gifts and improve their interpersonal relationships.
5. To help youth learn how to help others release their own creative gifts, talents, and potential.
6. To offer youth a practical opportunity to test theories of leadership and to explore the foundations of democratic leadership.
7. To help youth consider the ethical implications of leadership.
8. To help participants evaluate themselves and to learn from the evaluations of others.
9. To help youth develop and apply the types of behavioral skills which contribute to a group maintaining itself in good working order

sufficient to maximizing effective and appropriate group output.

10. To help participating boys and girls accept their own feelings and motivations while truly hearing and appreciating the feelings and motivations of others.

Selection and Sponsorship of Participants

Sponsors may choose to provide full and/or partial scholarships for students attending the Institute. Sponsors should work with local Middle School administration to identify students who would benefit from the program. Some Kiwanis Clubs designate scholarship funds that are limited to Builders Club members, while others draw participants from the entire student population. Every local Kiwanis Club should consider sponsoring one or more students to the program. Any other community group, organization, church, or association may choose to fund or sponsor a student participant.
